as a result of a diabetic foot ulcer






In 2017, 107,000 **Nova Scotians were** living with diabetes



1,200 to 2,000 had a diabetic foot ulcer



Nearly **220** had an amputation below the knee



Direct health-care costs:

Up to \$35 million a year







What can we do? In addition to improved screening and foot care, increased government funding for specialized devices can help prevent amputations and save our health-care system up to \$8.3 million a year.
